We will leave each member's boat in the water or the work racks, as space permits, for their requested days and then return them to their slips upon our return for regular business hours.

#### Dear Inlet Watch Members:

Once again, we find ourselves at the threshold of another year's end—and what a robust year it was for not only our membership, but also for the marina facility! Our slip sales experienced an incredibly successful year, with a 189% increase from the results of the previous year in 2024. Not to be out shadowed by sales, our slip rental program continued its increased progression with elevated slip rental rates, as well as welcoming new members to our family through dry and wet slip leases when the typical slip turnover occurred through the year. As for the activity around the marina—it was arguably record-setting for the last 12 months. During this time, we (1) completed the largest dredging project during the peak activity of the summer season, (2) began working on a comprehensive dry storage facilities maintenance and renovation project, (3) navigated and repaired major bulkhead damage in our Front Basin through the heart of the summer season, (4) completed significant repairs to extend the lives of our vital forklift machinery, and (5) initiated the largest ramp replacement project in our Side Basin in roughly 30 years.

As we shift our focus to the upcoming annual meeting, we do have one important amendment to our Bylaws that our board of directors has proposed. An email was sent to our undivided interest owners last week with advance information about this proposed amendment, which deals exclusively with the forms of approved notice to our membership. Last year, an amendment was proposed to allow for electronic communication to be an approved form of notice. It was embraced with overwhelming support with a 97% approval rate. Unfortunately, an unintended error in the text of the proposed amendment was discovered after last year's meeting. As can often be the case, a mistake presented a way for something much better to be proposed. Receiving the unanimous recommendation from our board of directors and our legal counsel is the proposed amendment to adopt the Notice provisions of the North Carolina Nonprofit Corporation Act (N.C. General Statute 55A-1-41). These provisions are included in this notice for the review of our undivided interest owners. They are comprehensive and have already been established by the State of North Carolina. We will be voting to adopt the provisions of N.C. General Statute 55A-1-41 at our upcoming annual meeting. As a final note on the proposed adoption of the provisions, even if you desire to receive printed and mailed notices from IWYC (e.g. the annual meeting notice), voting yes will allow your fellow IWYC member to choose if the electronic communication option is right for him/her.

Moving into 2026, we look to continue the plans on those major capital projects listed above, as well as breaking ground on the replacement of the Front Basin vinyl bulkhead and the related utilities for the adjacent wet slips. This project also includes the proposed expansion of the Front Basin with newly created wet slips in addition to those existing wet slips. We continue to work on the details of this project and look forward to sharing further details at the upcoming annual meeting. To assist with the maintenance and replacement projects, as well as the general operations of the marina, the board of directors approved a \$20/month increase of membership dues for each slip in 2026.

Our upcoming annual meeting will be held in the Winter Park Baptist Church Sanctuary instead of the Community Center. Driving and parking directions have been included for our members' convenience in the annual meeting notice. For those members who cannot attend in-person, an on-line virtual meeting option via Zoom will also be available. The 2026 Annual Meeting will take place on January 17, 2026 at 10 a.m. Further instructions and information about the planned virtual meeting will be made available to our membership as we are nearing its scheduled date. We look forward to discussing each of the items mentioned above and more at our upcoming annual meeting. As a final note, we encourage as many members as possible to conveniently complete a proxy/ballot electronically prior to the meeting. An invitation email to receive an electronic proxy/ballot will be sent to our members in the coming days prior to the annual meeting.

Thank you to all our members, board of directors and staff for their continued striving to make Inlet Watch such a success! Have a safe and wonderful holiday season everyone!

#### § 55A-1-41. Notice.

- (a) Notice under this Chapter shall be in writing unless oral notice is authorized in the corporation's articles of incorporation or bylaws and written notice is not specifically required by this Chapter.
- (b) Notice may be communicated in person; by electronic means; or by mail or private carrier. If these forms of personal notice are impracticable as to one or more persons, notice may be communicated to such persons by publishing notice in a newspaper, or by radio, television, or other form of public broadcast communication, in the county where the corporation has its principal place of business in the State, or if it has no principal place of business in the State, the county where it has its registered office.
- (c) Written notice by a domestic or foreign corporation to its member is effective when deposited in the United States mail with postage prepaid and correctly addressed to the member's address shown in the corporation's current record of members. Notice by a domestic corporation in the form of an electronic record sent by electronic means to a member who has designated an email address as provided in G.S. 55A-1-70(b) is effective when it is sent as provided in G.S. 66-325.
- (d) Written notice to a domestic or foreign corporation authorized to conduct affairs in this State may be addressed to its registered agent at its registered office or to the corporation or its secretary at its principal office shown in its articles of incorporation, the Designation of Principal Office Address form, or any Corporation's Statement of Change of Principal Office Address form filed with the Secretary of State.
- (e) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, written notice is effective at the earliest of the following:
  - (1) When received.
  - (2) Five days after its deposit in the United States mail, as evidenced by the postmark or otherwise, if mailed with at least first-class postage thereon prepaid and correctly addressed.
  - (3) On the date shown on the return receipt, if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, and the receipt is signed by or on behalf of the addressee.
  - (4) If mailed with less than first-class postage, 30 days after its deposit in the United States mail, as evidenced by the postmark or otherwise, if mailed with postage thereon prepaid and correctly addressed.
  - (5) When delivered to the member's address shown in the corporation's current list of members.

In the case of notice in the form of an electronic record sent by electronic means, the time of receipt shall be determined as provided in G.S. 66-325.

- (f) Written notice is correctly addressed to a member of a domestic or foreign corporation if addressed to the member's address shown in the corporation's current list of members. In the case of members who are residents of the same household and who have the same address, the corporation's bylaws may provide that a single notice may be given to the members jointly.
- (g) Oral notice is effective when actually communicated to the person entitled to oral notice.
- (h) If this Chapter prescribes notice requirements for particular circumstances, those requirements govern. If articles of incorporation or bylaws prescribe notice requirements not inconsistent with this section or other provisions of this Chapter, those requirements govern.
- (i) Written notice need not be provided in a separate document and may be included as part of a newsletter, magazine, or other publication regularly sent to members if conspicuously identified as a notice. (1993, c. 398, s. 1; 1995, c. 539, s. 16; 2008-37, s. 2; 2021-162, s. 2(b).)

#### Proposed Amendment to the By-laws of Inlet Watch Yacht Club, Inc.

Please vote on the proposed amendment.

#### Amendment #1: Adoption of Electronic Communication as an approved form of membership receipt

Existing excerpt from the By-Laws: Article VI: Notices, Section 1: Definition reads:

"Whenever under the provisions of the law, the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation or these By-Laws, notice is required to be given to any Director or member, it shall not be construed to mean personal notice; but such notice may be given to such Director or member in writing by depositing the same in the post office or letter box in a postpaid, sealed envelope addressed as appears on the books of the corporation."

### Replace with the following:

"Whenever under the provisions of the law, the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation or these By-Laws, notice is required to be given to any Director or member, it shall not be construed to be limited to actual, personal notice, or deposit of the same in the U.S. mail, but shall also include all those means set forth in N.C.G.S. 55A-1-41, including also by electronic means. However, nothing herein shall alter such notice as is required to a member involving liens against a member's fee simple undivided interest or to a person concerning the potential revocation of a Club Membership License Certificate held by such person, both of which shall require depositing written notice of the same by a postpaid, sealed envelope addressed to the last known address of such person as appears on the books of the corporation."
